### Bottle #2 Knob Creek Rye

Although the mash bill is undisclosed it is commonly believed that the rye content in this whiskey sits around the 51% mark. The oldest age statements are 9 years old. Beam sources from barrels in prime locations in their warehouses when making this rye whiskey.

Knob Creek's square bottles and newspaper inspired labelling is a homage to the bootleggers during prohibition who would stack their trucks with square bottles wrapped in newspaper.

### Bottle #3 Michter's US1 Small Batch Bourbon



Producer: Chatham Imports

Location: Kentucky, USA

ABV: 45.7%

### The Geeky Stuff

Michter's distills at the lowest legal temperature a bourbon can. The result of this is less water added post-distillation. While this leads to a far lower yield, it gives a richer depth of flavour. Michter's also uses barrels that have been dried out for as long as 48 months to reduce the tannin levels imparted into the whiskey.

### **Fun Fact**

Michter's legacy traces back to a distillery in Indiana founded in 1753 making it America's first whiskey company.

### Bottle #4 Cardhu 12 Year Old Single Malt

This 12yr old single malt from the Speyside region is the backbone of many Johnnie Walker blends. The 12 year age statement means that the youngest age a single malt that goes into Cardhu can be is 12 years old.

The highest selling single malt whisky in Spain is Cardhu 12.

### Bottle #5 Craigellachie 13yr old Single Malt

### The Geeky Stuff

This Speyside single malt is one of the few to still use a Worm Tub (essentially a long coil of copper pipe submerged in an enormous bath of cold water) when cooling vapours into liquid during distillation. This gives

Craigellachie a heavier, more savory spirit due to higher amounts of sulphur.

### **Fun Fact**

Craigellachie means "rocky hill," in reference to the cliff overlooking the River Spey across from the Macallan Distillery.

After 10 years of ageing this single malt is finished off for the last few months in Amoroso sherry casks (Amoroso is made by adding sweet, concentrated wine to Oloroso sherry). Talisker's Distillery is very much a product of its environment, embodying the characteristics of the rocky, storm lashed Isle of Skye.

### **Fun Fact**

Talisker is the scotch used in Drambuie, the beloved Isle of Skye liqueur. Anyone for a Rusty Nail?

### Green Spot Single Pot Still Irish Whiskey

Location: County Cork

### The Geeky Stuff

7-10 year old whiskeys matured in a combination of bourbon and sherry casks. Single Pot Still is considered to be the quintessential style of Irish Whiskey - these whiskeys must be produced by a single distillery, using a mixed mash of both malted and unmalted barley (at least 30% of each and up to 5% other cereals). The inclusion of unmalted barley generally results in a notably spicy and robust character.

### **Fun Fact**

Of the many famed personages to have enjoyed a tip of Green Spot over the years, Irish avant-garde playwright Samuel Beckett is one of the most interesting! While living in Paris, he would have friends ferry it over by the case from Westport.

## Bottle #8 Hibiki Japanese Harmony



Producer: Hibiki (Beam Suntory)

Location: Japan

ABV: 43%

### The Geeky Stuff

A blend of single malts from Suntory's Yamazaki and Hakushu distilleries, along with grain whisky from their Chita distillery. Harmony is matured in 5 different types of cask, which include American oak, Mizunara oak, and ex-Sherry butts. This bottling is exemplary of the careful craft of blending, where layers integrate and overlap to produce a complex yet seamless whole.

### **Fun Fact**

Harmony was introduced to the market as a replacement for the beloved Hibiki 12yr, which was discontinued. The 24 facets of this bottle represent the seasons of the Japanese calendar - carrying a whisky borne of time and careful attention.
